Methods / Approaches:

• Establishing learning groups – including to share information and seek entry points to shift power structures in natural resource governance. While not specific to territories of life governed by indigenous peoples and local communities, the experience with Forest Governance Learning Networks can provide some ideas and inspiration (see <u>Mayers et al.</u> 2013:57, <u>Mayers et al. 2009</u>).
